The major forces for further implementing medical simulation into existing curricula and training programs will most likely come from institutions with mandates to improve the quality of health care and enhance patient safety. Certification boards are expected to increase their utilization of simulation technology to objectively assess proficiency of skills relevant to physicians and the health care system. One of the core instruments to enhance these aims will be the summative assessment.
